The Rudder Association End of Year 2021 Report

University Leadership

- We have a new president, Dr. Katherine Banks, who has forcefully stated her love for Texas A&M and its world class traditions. She has taken the helm and welcomed TRA to a place at the table where your voice will always be heard. The Rudder Association is in close contact and meets monthly with Dr. Banks. We are standing by as she begins making reforms to our school and its structure.
- TRA has already interacted with five of the nine members of the A&M System's Board of Regents and will be reaching out to the others to ensure that your concerns about the future of Texas A&M are expressed unequivocally and are being shared with decision makers at the highest levels.
- General Joe Ramirez '79 has been appointed as the interim Vice President for Student Affairs and has worked closely with TRA on several areas including reforms of fish camp and scholarship support for cadets.
- The Vice-President for Marketing and Communications has welcomed TRA's input to ensure that Texas A&M's branding accurately reflects and actively promotes our values.

Student Impact

- No Aggie tradition is more important than Fish Camp in molding the next generation of Aggies. But in recent years many Aggie parents and former students have lost faith in this institution. Working groups from TRA and The Sul Ross Group identified serious deficiencies in the Fish Camp agenda and leadership selection process and reported these to General Ramirez. New processes for selecting student leaders and a renewed focus on Aggie traditions and history will now be implemented.
- The Corps must grow if our core values, Aggie spirit, and vital traditions are to continue. TRA lobbied President Banks and Vice-President Ramirez to restore the in-state tuition waivers for cadets which had been rescinded under the last administration--and they restored the previous cuts! More information on this and the *Patriot Scholarships* to come.
- TRA has met with the Athletic Director to strongly express our concerns with some student athlete's divisive political activism under the guise of "unity". A Fish Camp type experience for athletes is being discussed to make sure student athletes are as well versed in Aggie traditions and values as the 12th Man.
- TRA met with the university's chief operating officer to share your concerns that Covid-19 tests and quarantines should not lead to draconian restrictions on student academic, social and leadership opportunities this past year.
- Scholarships to deserving students have been awarded to students who have demonstrated a commitment to advancing traditional Aggie values in an effective way to their peers. These were individually donated by TRA members and did not come from the TRA treasury.
- TRA has defended the speech rights of students who have encountered resistance from some members of the university bureaucracy.
- TRA has sponsored like-minded student organizations such as the Aggie Rugby Team and Texas A&M's Young Americans for Freedom which planted 2,977 American flags on Simpson Drill Field in coordination with the Athletic Department's Red White and Blue 20-year commemoration.
- TRA saw to it that a recently implemented program involving racially segregated dorms was cancelled.

Education and Membership

- TRA publishes articles in support of conservative reforms to its members, Texas A&M administrators, and the larger Aggie community in traditional, electronic and social media formats such as our Facebook page: The Rudder Association Portal--<https://www.facebook.com/groups/401483437993685>
- Meetings with other local representatives and influential legislators are continuing.
- Updated by-laws and 501c3 application will ensure that TRA is the most respected and valued organization you could entrust with your resources and good name.
- Hired an accounting firm to create and file budgets as part of our 501c3 filing with the state.
- Selected a respected accountant to be our treasurer as part of our "two-deep" integrity.

All accomplished with thousands of hours of volunteer work from the like-minded Aggies on your TRA board and other selfless members. TRA has only **one part-time employee** and operates on a **shoestring budget**. While much has been accomplished, much work remains to be done. What we value most is your membership and engagement. Without that, the TRA would no longer have the moral authority to influence the critical issues facing Texas A&M and our larger culture.
